At some point in time he gave me the book "*Gotham*" by Edwin G Burrows and Mike Wallace (not the 60 minutes guy). It's been on my book shelf for too long and I finally decided to tackle this 1236 page tome this year. I finished it! The history is from 1664 to 1900.
